Native Perennial Grasses

Indiangrass Sorghastrum nutans

Up to 7' tall
Well drained bottom land to sandy soil
Sunny location
Soft, golden-brown plume-like seedheads in
September
Excellent cover for wildlife in winter and spring
Seeds attract wildlife



Little Bluestem Schizachyrium scoparium

2-3' tall
Prefers dry, sandy soil
Full sun
Soft golden-brown plume-like seedheads in September
Mixes well with native wildflowers
Excellent wildlife habitat in winter and spring
Source of food for deer and other wildlife



Switchgrass Panicum virgatum

3-6' tall
Grows in a wide range of soils
Full sun
Leaves turn golden in fall
Provides excellent winter and spring cover for wildlife
Seeds eaten by many species of wildlife
Moderately salt tolerant



Riverbank Wild Rye Elymus riparius

3-5' tall Prefers moist or wet soil Partial shade Tolerates flooding Grows in the cool season



NoMow Seed (without Rye)

Mixture of 6 slow-growing fine fescue varieties

Sandy, loamy, or well-drained clay with at least 4" of good, loose topsoil
Prefers full sun or partial shade
Once established, water only during dry periods
